Over the next several months this section of the newsletter will be featuring a different letter each month contributed by pChris from C.S.Lewis' book *The Screwtape Letters*.

"In the book Lewis imagines a series of lessons in the importance of taking a deliberate role in Christian <u>faith</u> by portraying a typical human life, with all its temptations and failings, seen from devils' viewpoints. Screwtape holds an administrative post in the <u>bureaucracy</u> ("Lowerarchy") of Hell, and acts as a <u>mentor</u> to his nephew Wormwood, an inexperienced and incompetent tempter.

In the 31 letters which comprise the book, Screwtape gives Wormwood detailed advice on various methods of undermining <u>God</u>'s words and of promoting abandonment of God in "the Patient" (whom Wormwood is tempting), interspersed with observations on human nature and on the <u>Bible</u>. In Screwtape's advice, selfish gain and power are seen as the only good, and neither demon can comprehend <u>God's love for man</u> or acknowledge human virtue." wikipedia

"Our cause (the Devils) is never more in danger than when a human, no longer desiring, but still intending, to do our Enemy's (God's) will, looks round upon a universe from which every trace of Him (God) seems to have vanished, and asks why he has been forsaken, and yet still obeys."


